Our board members and mentors are passionate about providing girls in high school with an opportunity that we didn't have ourselves: to be connected with a woman mentor who is just a bit older and has already "been through it" and can provide advice, guidance, perspective, and support in ways that school counsellors and parents often can't.

ORIGIN STORY

HOW IT BEGAN

As 2019 Daughters of the Vote delegates, the four founders of She Connects - Emily Haugen, Avneet Sandhu, Meghan Dunn, and Leena Parhar - had the opportunity to sit in the House of Commons and Senate in Ottawa and bring to the attention of our leaders the concerns facing our communities. The four then applied for the Rosemary Spears Leadership Grant to launch their idea of *She Connects* to provide a mentorship opportunity to young women that was not available to them when they were navigating high school.

She Connects is a volunteer initiative that provides virtual/online mentorship to young women. As a grassroots movement, our main goal is to connect young women in high school with women mentors in their 20s, to foster thought-exchange, dialogues, and trusting relationships. She Connects provides a safe space for youth and allows them to speak to a mentor directly about anything they might need support with.

Our mentors support mentees with the appropriate resources and tools for success and resiliency. With this mentorship program, we strive to uplift women and empower them to be the driving force in their own lives.

She Connects programs are inclusive to women, girls, and gender non-conforming folks of all identities.


MENTORSHIP APPLICATIONS



MENTOR AND MENTEE FEEDBACK IMPACT SUMMARY

She Connects provides mentors and mentees the opportunity to provide ongoing feedback in the form of a monthly survey. In 2022, we received a total of 128 completed mentor surveys and 6 feedback surveys from our mentees.

MENTEE FEEDBACK

How long have you been a mentee with She Connects?

Mentees have been with She Connects for a few months to half a year.

Have you used the She Connects mentorship guidebook? If so, was it helpful?

Mentees noted the guidebook is helpful and serves as a useful resource initially but not always utilized strictly, to allow for natural conversation.

Is the She Connects mentorship program meeting your needs? What can we do to make your experience better?

Mentees noted that their needs are being met through the mentorship program, their mentor is a good fit and that they are unsure of how to change the program to enhance their experience.


Please indicate your overall experience with She Connects?

Themed responses:

- interactions took place once per month ranging from 30 mins to 1.5 hours via video calls, emails and intermittent texting
- Some mentors interacted with mentees 2-3 times per month for 1-2 hours in duration
- Other mentors met 5+ times per month for 30 mins to 1 hour per meet up

Have you used your mentorship guidebook? If so, was it helpful?

Themed responses:

- some mentors utilized the mentorship guidebook initially for driving conversation which provided a foundation but later shifted to more organic conversation
- While some mentors continue to use the guidebook as it helps structure conversations and navigate challenging topics

MENTOR FEEDBACK

Have you had any issues reaching your mentee? If so, please explain.

Themed responses:

- Many mentors had little to no issues connecting with their mentees
- Alternatively, other mentors had common challenges which includes rescheduling as a result of pre-existing commitments (i.e. school)

Is there anything that we can do to assist you and your mentee at this time?

Themed responses:

- The vast majority of mentors expressed that they do not currently need further assistance
- Other mentors noted needing assistance with understanding if mentees are needing to re-apply for the mentorship program

Do you have any feedback, comments or concerns for us to help improve the program?

Themed responses:

- The vast majority noted no additional comments, and happy with the program
- Some mentors noted an updated guidebook for the next cycle
- Providing opportunities for mentors and mentees to connect with each other in a social setting



Previous years income has been the main source of income through grants and organization donations.


This resulted in a cash balance to cover expenses for 2022 and 2023.

She Connects has applied for funding from the Government of Canada to hire a summer student for the summer of 2023. We plan to provide a rewarding work experience by giving them the opportunity to express what they are interested in and what skills they would like to learn. Our summer student will be invaluable in creating new systems for She Connects and providing a youth voice in enhancing our programs. Our fully remote role will be accessible to any youth within Canada.

EXPANDING OUR VOLUNTEER PROGRAM

Recognizing the need for more volunteer support, we are thrilled to have created a new Director of Volunteers position on our Board this past year. We are working on recruiting skilled volunteers who can help our Directors with their workload. These volunteers will bring diverse interests and ideas to She Connects. Our volunteer opportunity will also provide young people with the chance to develop skills and enhance their resume.

REACHING MORE RURAL COMMUNITIES AND COMMUNITIES OF COLOUR

We want the mentorship that She Connects provides to be accessible to all self-identified young women who would like to take part. We want to work with youth organizations in rural communities to make our mentorship program more accessible to youth in all parts of Canada. We also want to reach more BIPOC communities in Canada and make our mentorship program accessible and relevant to all.

FOCUS ON EVALUATION AND CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT

Our mentors and mentees are our best resource in telling us what we are doing right, and what we need to change! With the creation of a new role on our board, the Director of Evaluation, we will be focusing on evaluating the impact and efficiency our She Connects programs. We will use the data to determine how we can make our programs more meaningful for our mentors, mentees, and volunteers.
